R1 VINCENNES [L-H]

**C1 - PRIX DE NAUCELLES - 2700m (a1m1/2) - Class B - Harness - EUR €
43,000**

- 1. NEBBIO DU LIAMONE** - Looked very ordinary when eliminated in a 2850m Class C here a month back and is not about to spring any surprises
- 2. NIKY ELDE** - Honest colt that gave a good account on re-entry in a 2100m Class C here on 17 December. Will have shaken the cobwebs off him and has a reasonable chance of finishing in first 3 this time
- 3. NELATI DE MORGANE** - Takes to the main track for the first time after finishing 5th, a place behind NIKY ELDE (2), in a 2100m Class C here on 17 December. Was not far off the mark that day and can repeat
- 4. NOT THIS TIME** - Showed a liking for the main track on 31 December when 2nd in a Class D over course and distance. Eric Raffin in the bike again and will be expecting to bring the fight to NEMOS DU GOUTIER (6)
- 5. NOBEL DU LEARD** - Made short work of a Class D over track and trip on 4 December. In more exalted company this time but the nature of his recent success augurs well for his chances
- 6. NEMOS DU GOUTIER** - Held his own to run 3rd in a 2850m Class A here on Christmas Eve. Is plainly a colt with a bright future and can finally get that maiden monkey off his back
- 7. NATURALE MAG** - Opened his main-track account in late-November before flopping over the inner course on Christmas Eve, and will need to show marked improvement

Summary: Barring his late-November elimination, NEMOS DU GOUTIER (6) has done everything asked of him and drops down the category-ladder with a realistic chance of losing his maiden tag. Damien Bonne will be justifiably wary though of NOT THIS TIME (4) who gave a fine account in a Class D under these conditions just late last month. NOBEL DU LEARD (5) opened his Vincennes account with ease early last month and even though in better company this time, still looks a player.

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**C2 - PRIX RADIO FG - PRIX DE FRESNES - 2100m (a1m1/4) - Class D -
Harness - EUR € 40,000**

- 1. MAGOT D'OR PIYA** - Left a very good impression when imposing over 2200m here on 9 December. Benefits from a terrific entry and has a reasonable chance of doubling his money
- 2. MALABAR MAGO** - Lost his maiden status at Graignes in November but has twice failed to deliver at Vincennes since and even with hind shoes off is unlikely to spice things up
- 3. MELKIOR DE BAILLY** - Showed improvement when 4th in a 2100m Class E here on 1 January. Matthieu Abrivard in the bike again and from the 3-spot cannot be discounted
- 4. MERCURY DELO** - Placed in 3 straight, including over the short course, before losing all chance at the start of a 2700m Class D here in late-October. Has been afforded time to recalibrate and will be barefoot this time. First 5
- 5. MYTHIQUE JOSSELYN** - Produced quite the performance to win a 2850m Class E over the short course on 24 December. Trainer in the bike this time and will not be far off the mark if he keeps him trotting
- 6. MOGALDO DU PARC** - Won 3 from 4 before making little impact in a Class C under these conditions in early-October. Is plainly a good future prospect and racing barefoot can make all the difference
- 7. MARENO BELLO** - Has ability but not the easiest of horses to handle. Eliminated over 2700m here 2.5 weeks ago and may just be taking on too much this time
- 8. MARCHAND DE REVE** - Capable but unremarkable colt racing first-time barefoot after finishing last but one in a Class E over track and trip on 1 January. Disregard
- 9. MAGIC DE BANVILLE** - Took little time to show form after his Cabourg re-entry. Ran 2nd to a good horse here in November that has since gone on to confirm and could well open his Vincennes account
- 10. MILLESIME STAR** - Well-campaigned element that is better than latest results would suggest. Is unlikely to get off the mark but with application can play a role
- 11. MITCH DE GRANOU** - Sports a new configuration after running surprise 5th in a Cabourg Class E 9 days ago and in this company has no possible chance
- 12. MAGIC FRIENDS** - In the frame in both Vincennes starts at the end of last year, latterly 3rd to MAGOT D'OR PIYA (1) in a 2200m Class E a month ago. Not ideally-drawn but should nevertheless acquit himself honourably
- 13. MUST DREAM** - Complicated but clearly talented individual that was quickly eliminated in a Class E over course and distance on New Year's Eve. Sports front pads this time and will not be far from the action if given a chance to express himself
- 14. MUNCH CLUB** - Surprise 3rd in a Class E under these conditions 3 weeks ago but failed to confirm on New Year's Day and can be confidently passed over

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Summary: Beaten by little over the short course on his Vincennes debut in early-November, MAGIC DE BANVILLE (9) may not have been seen out since but he will be competitively-shod for the first time and can bring home the bacon if Theo Duvaldestin successfully negotiates the start. The better-placed MAGOT D'OR PIYA (1), however, did impose here at the first time of asking, and most certainly has the wherewithal to repeat. Given a rest after failing to deliver here in early-October, MOGALDO DU PARC (6) returns barefoot and is well-placed to give this a good go, as is a freshly-barefoot MYTHIQUE JOSSELYN (5) who lost her maiden tag over the inner track on Christmas Eve.

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C3 - PRIX DJERID - 2700m (a1m1/2) - Gr3 - Mounted - EUR € 90,000

- 1. JAZZ IN MONTREUX** - 3rd to EROS ZOLA (8) in Gr.3 Prix de l'Île d'Oléron in mid-November before running 6th to IMPALA DE VAL (10) in Gr.3 Prix Yvonnick Bodin a fortnight ago. Is back in safer hands and will be expected to put things right. Place chance
- 2. GAZELLE DE VAL** - Won a Gr.2 here this time last year but has been less sharp since, and latest results do little to inspire confidence
- 3. GOOD GIRL MARCEAUX** - No slouch on a good day and is shod for competition, but in this company will have too much to do
- 4. GO OR NOT** - Has failed this winter to replicate the previous season's form and is not easy to recommend
- 5. GOLD VOICE** - Seldom gets her nose in front but gave a reassuringly good account behind IMPALA DE VAL (10) in Gr.3 Prix Yvonnick Bodin over track and trip late last month and should logically give another honourable account
- 6. FILOU D'ANJOU** - Failed to confirm good Gr.3 Prix Auguste François performance when 7th to IMPALA DE VAL (10) in Prix Yvonnick Bodin a fortnight ago and looks a minor place chance at best
- 7. GRECO BELLO** - Debuts under the saddle at the ripe old age of 10. Showed her form here last month though and is not incapable of making first 5
- 8. EROS ZOLA** - Has been excelling in both codes over recent months, latterly dynamic winner of 2175m Gr.2 Prix Jules Lemonnier here 3 weeks ago, and in similar form could well pull the rug out from under IMPALA DE VAL (10)
- 9. HANNIBAL TUILERIE** - 5th behind IMPALA DE VAL (10) in a Gr.3 under these conditions a month ago. Is regularly in the thick of things and, on determination alone, can finish in the mix
- 10. IMPALA DE VAL** - Serious element that hardly put a foot wrong under the saddle over past 12 months. Takes on all comers with the same gusto and is certainly good enough to keep the victory-train rolling

Summary: On paper, this looks a 2-horse race, with preference just going to IMPALA DE VAL (10) who enjoyed a remarkably productive 2025. That being said, EROS ZOLA (8) just picked up his first Vincennes Gr.2, in terrific fashion, and will be no easy touch. Unplaced in the Gr.2 Prix Yvonnick Bodin, JAZZ IN MONTREUX (1) will be reunited with Pierre-Yves Verva for whom he goes well, and should not disappoint. HANNIBAL TUILERIE (9) always acquits himself well when barefoot here and his Gr.3 Prix Auguste François run did not go unnoticed.

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**C4 - PRIX DE BELGIQUE-AMERIQUE RACES Q6 - 2850m (a2m) - Gr2 -
Harness - EUR € 120,000**

- 1. HALO AM** - Modest individual with no place in this line-up and can be confidently written off
- 2. IROISE DE LA NOE** - Carefully-prepared this winter but most unlucky in Gr.2 Prix de Bourgogne late last month. Showed her form all the same, will be entrusted to Eric Raffin for the first time, and in this smaller field can impose if kept out of harm's way
- 3. KANTO AVIS** - Disappointing on the whole this winter, most recently 7th in Gr.1 Prix Ténor de Baune, and will need to find considerably more
- 4. WORKING CLASS HERO** - 2nd in Prix Ténor de Baune and 5th in Prix de France last year. Has 2 runs under his belt since being sent for a break last summer. Disappointing in Gr.3 Prix Jean Dumouch but should not be too hastily-judged. First 5
- 5. JANGO VICI** - Ran honourable 7th of 16 in Gr.2 Prix de Bourgogne a fortnight back. Will not be at 52-1 this time but is unlikely to be as competitive either
- 6. KING OPERA** - Ran 4th behind IMMORTAL DOC (7) in Gr.2 Prix Doynel de Saint-Quentin but lost his action in Prix Ténor de Baune. Is plainly in good shape though and cannot be discounted
- 7. IMMORTAL DOC** - Raced better in Prix du Bourbonnais than the result would suggest, before confirming in Gr.1 Prix Tenor de Baune. Will be reunited with Bjorn Goop who won a Gr.1 in Gothenburg with him last summer and must be considered a priority
- 8. J'AIME LE FOOT** - Last but one in Prix de Bourgogne and even racing barefoot this time still looks out of his depth
- 9. FRANK GIO** - Wonderfully-consistent individual that put in quite the showing when 2nd to Liza Josselyn in Gr.1 Critérium Continental on 21 December. Showed excellent speed that day and in similar shape could well win this
- 10. KRACK TIME ATOUT** - Classy individual that will have come on for his Tenor de Baune 4th place 3 weeks ago. Is a Gr.1 winner under these conditions and will be expected to play a prominent role
- 11. IZOARD VEDAQUAIS** - Made up for Prix de Bretagne elimination when 3rd in Prix du Bourbonnais. Is not as competitively-shod this time but still has the wherewithal to pick up some prizemoney
- 12. KOCTEL DU DAIN** - Serious element that was never at his ease in Gr.2 Prix Doynel de Saint-Quentin before failing to deliver in Prix Tenor de Baune. Has been reconfigured for the occasion and must not be underestimated
- 13. HOOKER BERRY** - Not the horse he was when winning the Prix d'Amérique in 2023. Ran 3rd in this race 12 months ago, but has just the one race under his belt this term and is unlikely to spring any surprises

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Summary: Winner of this race in 2025, and subsequently unlucky in the Prix d'Amerique, IROISE DE LA NOE (2) was deserted by Lady Luck once again in the Prix de Bourgogne a fortnight ago. She does, however, excel over 2850m here and has been reconfigured, and the engagement of Eric Raffin speaks volumes. The 7-times champion driver will still want to be wary of the only 5yo in the field, FRANK GIO (9), whose Gr.1 Criterium Continental second place was particularly eye-catching, and IMMORTAL DOC (7) who ran 2nd in the Gr.1 Prix Tenor de Baune on the same day. Two places behind him, on his first objective of the winter, KRACK TIME ATOUT (10) will be barefoot as he was when victorious in the Gr.1 Criterium des 5 Ans in September.

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C5 - PRIX DU JURA - 2100m (a1m1/4) - Class B - Harness - EUR € 75,000

- 1. HASARD D'ERABLE** - Was particularly sharp during the summer but rather disappointing lately. Has been reconfigured for the occasion and cannot be ruled out
- 2. HAMONET DE CHOISEL** - Should not be too hastily-judged for failing to produce the goods in a Class B over track and trip on 13 December. Was superb here a fortnight earlier and a similar effort would see him contest the finish
- 3. HOLD UP DU SAPTEL** - Blows hot and cold but has nothing to prove in this category. Lost ground at the start here 3 weeks ago but benefits from both a terrific draw and entry and looks competitive for a cheque
- 4. GAZ D'OCCAGNES** - Produced a pair of surprisingly good efforts before being found wanting behind HOLD UP DU SAPTEL (3) 3 weeks ago. Is well-placed in front but others still preferred
- 5. GILMOUR** - Pleased more than once here last winter but currently looks a shadow of his former self and is unlikely to create an upset
- 6. HABIT DE SOIREE** - Solid during the autumn but trounced in last 2. Eric Raffin stays faithful but represents a minor place chance at best
- 7. GUERRIER CASTELETS** - 4th to HAMONET DE CHOISEL (2) in late-November before repeating in a 2850m Class D a month back. In much better company this time and chances appear limited
- 8. IBIZA BELLA** - Was going good-guns in Gr.2 GNT Final on 30 November before being blocked in, finishing 8th. Makes just 2nd start over 2100m here but can make a big splash if still on the boil
- 9. GRAND ROI KALOUMA** - Back under harness after an unexceptional run in the other code here early last month. Is undeniably useful but may need the race
- 10. GLADIATOR BOY** - Decent servant in the monte discipline. Runs here for a change of scenery and can be ruled out
- 11. HOVE PONT VAUTIER** - Capable on a good day but has failed to convince in either comeback run. Shoes fitted this time and poses no threat
- 12. IDOLE D'OURVILLE** - Has not put a foot out of line since early-September. Has never failed to deliver for Benjamin Rochard and will be expected to figure more prominently than he did 2.5 weeks ago
- 13. HOCHE** - Tough type making first appearance since running 2nd to HAMONET DE CHOISEL (2) in a Class C over course and distance on 27 November. Is unlikely to get his nose in front but can nevertheless compete for a place on the podium
- 14. HOLD UP DREAM** - Useful individual that ran 2nd of 16 in a Class D over track and trip last weekend. Boasts a good record with Alexandre Abrivard and despite the draw can still play an active role

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Summary: A tough campaigner that was particularly unlucky in the Gr.2 GNT Final in late-November, IBIZA BELLA (8) is seldom seen over these shorter trips but she does have solid references, starts in front, and has a decent chance to make amends and win this. She will be opposed though by HAMONET DE CHOISEL (2) who imposed from the same draw over course and distance in late-November. IDOLE D'OURVILLE (12) has turned a corner this winter and steps marginally up in category with a good hand to play. Unraced since coming 2nd to Anthony Barrier's horse in late-November, HOCHE (13) has been handed an unattractive number, but presents good references over 2100m here and must be taken seriously.

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C6 - PRIX DE RIBERAC - 2700m (a1m1/2) - Gr3 - Harness - EUR € 80,000

- 1. MARVINA BELLA** - Has a pair of runs under her belt since the layoff but will need to show considerable improvement on last Monday's effort here
- 2. GIORGIA D'ESI** - Quality Italian sort making French debut after prepping at San Siro. Is not always the most reliable but with a leading driver at the helm will be afforded every chance
- 3. MOUSKIE DE GUEZ** - Tricky but honest filly that ran 4th, a place behind MONICA JISCE (6), in a Class A under these conditions last weekend. Is not a priority but can still get a look in
- 4. MARILOU** - Showed promise last spring but subsequently failed to live up to expectations. Has not been seen out since early-November and is not about to spice things up
- 5. MIRA DE FROULAY** - Ran 2nd in a Class A over track and trip in late-November and was then disqualified, when unthreatening, in 3 January race of reference, and can expect to have few friends
- 6. MONICA JISCE** - Serious sort but is never far from losing her action. Surprise 3rd in a Class A under these conditions last weekend and should be taken more seriously this time
- 7. MARIE OH FREDLAU** - 3rd in a 2850m Gr.3 here in late-November prior to running 4th to MY LADY CASTELLE (10) in a 2175m Class A 3 weeks ago. Consistently gives her best and although unlikely to win this can still make first 5
- 8. MOSTRA DE BANVILLE** - Dynamic winner of a Gr.3 over course and distance on 6 November. Was not up to the next task but will be barefoot for the first time and with application can make this her own
- 9. MOOREA DE CHANLECY** - Modest 5th behind MONICA JISCE (6) in a Class A under these conditions last weekend. Goes barefoot this time but is still not easy to recommend
- 10. MY LADY CASTELLE** - Failed to deliver in a Gr.2, a place ahead of MOSTRA DE BANVILLE (8), in mid-November but dominated a 2175m Class A 3 weeks ago, and in similar condition can give her a run for her money
- 11. GLORY WINNER** - Serious individual that seldom disappoints and showed her form at San Siro in early-November. Has a lot going for her here and looks every part a place prospect

Summary: Commanding winner of the Gr.3 Prix de Vaumas here in early-November, MOSTRA DE BANVILLE (8) struggled to make her presence felt in the Gr.2 Prix Guy Deloison 10 days later. She returns fresh and barefoot though, and has previously had the measure of MY LADY CASTELLE (10) who most recently won a Class A here. Justifiably well-regarded Italian filly GLORY WINNER (11) makes her first foray into France after a solid run in Milan and has been entrusted to Eric Raffin for the occasion. Compatriot GIORGIA D'ESI (2) will be reined by fellow-countryman Gabriele Gelormini and merits respect.

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**C7 - PRIX DE CAVAILLON - 2100m (a1m1/4) - Class D - Harness - EUR €
40,000**

- 1. LORENZO BERRY** - Tricky but talented element that has struggled somewhat this term, but is reunited with Alexandre Abrivard who was the last to win with him, and deserves to be retained
- 2. LEONARDO DU DERBY** - Useful sort that ran good 2nd in a 2175m Class D here a month back. Takes on some better horses this time but still looks competitive for a cheque
- 3. LOCO FLIGNY** - Tough type that comfortably won a Class D over 2700m here on 18 November. Freshened up here a week ago and, considering the entry, is easy to fancy for the win
- 4. LE MIRACLE** - Hardy individual being reunited with Matthieu Abrivard after registering a pair of places in the provinces. Will race first-time barefoot, and breaking from the 4-spot will do his chances no disservice
- 5. LENNON D'HERFRAIE** - Back under harness after a brace of unexceptional monte runs. Is confirmed under these conditions, and runs barefoot for the occasion, but is probably being aimed too high
- 6. LORD DE BANVILLE** - Modest trotter that has made no impact in either code for some time and can be passed over
- 7. LOIC BARON** - Shod to preference following a brace of return runs but is still not about to shake things up
- 8. LOULOU DES OUBEAX** - Finished 4th in a Bordeaux Class D 2.5 weeks ago despite being denied a run, on just 2nd start for new trainer. Is plainly close to his best and with more luck in running, can redeem himself. Chance
- 9. LEXINGTON DANICA** - 5th in a Bordeaux Class D 2.5 weeks ago despite not being afforded a run. Has been reconfigured for return to Paris and Benjamin Rochard will be eager to set the record straight
- 10. LOUIS QUATORZE** - Starts for first time since running 2nd at Chartres on 3 November. Has no particular love for Vincennes and with shoes on will have nothing to contribute
- 11. LE MAESTRO** - Has twice failed to confirm early-November success but returns to racing barefoot and can get in on the action if Nicolas Bazire successfully navigates the start
- 12. LIVINIO FLAC** - Handy type that won 3 of 4 before being sent for a holiday in August. Has not been seen out since and is going to need the race

Summary: Ideally-engaged at the limit of earnings, LOCO FLIGNY (3) imposed at this level in November before prepping here last weekend, and barefoot from the 3-spot looks a major contender. Starting wide on the front line, both LOULOU DES OUBEAX (8) and LEXINGTON DANICA (9) were most unlucky in Bordeaux on Boxing Day, but will be reined this time by Eric Raffin and Benjamin Rochard respectively, and Marc Sassier's runner sports modified shoeing. Barefoot this time, LE MAESTRO (11) is never the easiest to gauge but is clearly in competition-mode.

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**C8 - PRIX DE TOULOUSE - 2700m (a1m1/2) - Class D - Harness - EUR €
46,000**

- 1. JUMBO JACK** - Found wanting, and ultimately eliminated, on comeback in a 2850m Class E here 2.5 weeks ago. Will have come on for the race and with application can get a look in
- 2. JOKER D'OLAIN** - Fine servant in the provinces but was well-beaten on Vincennes debut last Monday. Sports a fresh configuration but still not a concern
- 3. JAGUAR DE KARA** - Back under harness after winning his last 2 monte starts. Is shod for the occasion but has form in this code and should not be discounted
- 4. JYTRACE DE HOUELLE** - Superb winner at Lyon-La Soie only to be disqualified prior to winning a 2175m Class E here 11 days ago. Is unlikely to double his money but can nonetheless contest a place on the podium
- 5. JASPE DU DOLLAR** - Returns to Paris after some fine performances in the provinces. Is confirmed under these conditions, will be competitively-shod this time, and is unlikely to be far off the mark
- 6. JUBLA VIKING** - Takes a time-out from the monte code. Races shod on this occasion and is clearly here for reasons of conditioning
- 7. JOVIAL HAUFOR** - Got back in the game when 3rd in a Class D under these conditions on 27 December. Was even somewhat unlucky that day and should prove the main threat to JADOU DU LUPIN (8)
- 8. JADOU DU LUPIN** - Consistently-performant type that just missed out on the hat-trick when 2nd at Angers early last month. Is considerably better than the field and Antoine Wiels will be eager to prove the point once more
- 9. JAMAICA BROWN** - Won an amateur event here on 30 December before being eliminated in a 2850m Class D last Monday, and given the entry, she will have a decent chance of putting things right

Summary: An absolute dynamo that rarely lets the side down when focused, JADOU DU LUPIN (8) is seldom seen at Vincennes but has acquitted himself well on both occasions, runs barefoot for the occasion, and can make up for just missing out here in October. JOVIAL HAUFOR (7) gave a very good account of himself under these conditions late last month and, with form maintained, should prove the main danger. JAMAICA BROWN (9) blows hot and cold but enjoys a nice entry here and, reconfigured for the race, can get back in the game. JYTRACE DE HOUELLE (4) is plainly back at the top of his own game and steps up in category with a good card to play.

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C9 - PRIX DE CHERBOURG-EN-COTENTIN - 2700m (a1m1/2) - Class C -
Mounted - EUR € 46,000

1. MAESTRO MUSIC - Useful sort that has shown better aptitude in this branch of the business. Takes on some good fillies this time though and has ground to make up on his late-November performance

2. MAYA GERBEHAYE - Got off the mark in a Class E under these conditions on Christmas Day. Takes on a better lot this time but will be fitted with front pads and, with application, can finish thereabouts

3. MARIO DE LA VALLEE -

4. MAYA DES GENETS - Ran 6th behind MAMZELL L'AVENTURE (6) on comeback in a Class D over course and distance on 17 December. Is proven at a superior level, races first-time barefoot, and should not be underestimated

5. MISSY DE JIEL - Won over course and distance in December but has looked very ordinary since and will need to get her house in order

6. MAMZELL L'AVENTURE - Serious future prospect with a liking for the Vincennes profile. Gets to race competitively-shod for the first time and has every chance of making the frame once again

7. MUST DE CHANLEYC - Quality individual that has placed in 2 of 3 monte starts at a similar level. Has yet to disappoint for Eric Raffin and looks thoroughly capable of getting off the mark this time

8. MISS BLACK BERRY - Plainly talented but has failed to finish either monte race unscathed. Alexandre Abrivard stays faithful in the knowledge that it is just a question of time

Summary: Reduced to 7 runners following the withdrawal of MARIO DE LA VALLEE (3), the way looks considerably less-complicated for the progressive MUST DE CHANLEYC (7) who races barefoot for the first time. Leading the opposition are a freshly-configured MAMZELL L'AVENTURE (6) who has left us in no doubt about her ridden potential, and the nicely-engaged MISS BLACK BERRY (8) who will be no pushover if she gets off on the right foot.
