


1. BIG CALL (USA)

Was improved a bit after a start in Gold Cup (Gr 1) and came in second in Prix de Reux Stakes (Gr 3) in Deauville behind Junko. Early contender.

Big Call (by Animal Kingdom) made his debut with a victory at Limerick Racecourse under the training of Joseph P O'Brien. He then had a brief period under Hong Kong-based Richard Gibson before ultimately landing in France under the guidance of Christophe Ferland. This offspring of Animal Kingdom competed in June during Royal Ascot in the main event, the Gold Cup (Gr 1), but never had a real chance. The gelding is the highest-rated participant in the Cup, thanks to two Group 3 victories in the Prix Gladiateur and the Prix de Barbeville at Longchamp. He is a serious challenger, with some consideration for the French racing style - a moderate pace initially and a full-on sprint in the final quarter.


Has started three times in the Cup with a second spot behind very gifted Square de Luynes as the best result. Has boosted his form rating and is a typical outsider this year.

Espen Hill (by Helsinki) has had a brilliant season as a seven-year-old so far, with impressive victories in races such as Kapp's Stora Pris and a third-place finish in the SM Classic, boosting his form rating to an impressive 94. Madeleine Smith's offspring of Helsinki has made three previous appearances in the Cup. In 2020, the gelding finished second to Square de Luynes in a Scandinavian edition of the Cup due to covid restrictions. In 2021, the gelding finished fourth, once again behind winning Square De Luynes. Last year, he finished sixth behind Hard One To Please, but was only beaten by 2.5 lengths. A typical outsider.

2. GO ON CARLRAS





Scored a very impressive victory in Scandinavian Open Championship (Gr 3) in the seasonal debut and looked splendid when he won very easily in the last race in Gothenburg. Could cause an upset.



Go On Carlras (by Harzand) finished second in the Danish Derby behind gifted Iron Butterfly, who participated in the Cup last year. She followed up with a second-place finish in the Danish Oaks and a surprise victory in the Stockholm Fillies & Mares Stakes at the end of her three-year-old campaign. The mare made her four-year-old debut by causing another surprise, this time impressively, with a victory in the Scandinavian Open Championship (Gr 3). She then performed well in the Hamburger Stuten Cup (L) despite carrying a heavy weight. She prepared for the Cup showing excellent form with a very comfortable victory in the Kopparm‰rra race. Could cause a big surprise.

4. CAPTAIN CHORUS (GB)





Is in great shape as a five-year-old and scored a really nice victory in Oslo Cup (L). Much tougher task in this Stockholm Cup and will try to earn some money.

Captain Chorus (by Paco Boy) was promising as a young horse, but apart from a respectable fourth-place finish in the Norwegian Derby in 2021 behind Stroxx Carlras and a victory in a handicap race at the end of his three-year-old campaign, the gelding didn't stand out significantly. As a four-year-old, he secured victories in a relatively unremarkable Norwegian St Leger at Øvrevoll and an Open Handicap at Bro Park. However, as a five-year-old, Cathrine Erichsen seems to have found the winning formula for him. He notably defeated Espen Hill in an Open Handicap (albeit with a weight advantage) at Bro Park and triumphed in the Oslo Cup (L). Nevertheless, he is expected to face a tough challenge in this Stockholm Cup.

Seneschal (by Appel Au Maitre) did manage to secure a passable result in last year's edition of the Cup, finishing eighth but only 4.5 lengths behind. This six-year-old gelding relies primarily on his stamina, and aside from two victories in Kapp's Stora, his wins in the Swedish St Leger in 2020 and the Norwegian St Leger in 2021 stand out on his resume. He began his six-year-old season with a debut in the Forårs Cup at Klampenborg but had no chance against the victorious Suspicious Mind. Since then, he has been a clear second to Espen Hill in Kapp's Stora and the SM Classic. He likes to compete on Bro Park's turf over longer



Prins Valiant (by Lope de Vega) is the only participant in the Cup with a form rating below 90, namely at 86. His track record doesn't stand out significantly in this context, with the exception of a victory in the Fyensløbet 2022, where he carried top weight in Odense. However, it's worth noting a fifth-place finish in a weak Norwegian Derby in 2020, well behind winning Whispering Ocean. One potential factor in favor of the Lope de Vega offspring is that the six-year-old is now under the training of Niels Petersen. Regardless, it's unlikely that he will contend for a top placement.

Ayani (by Starspangledbanner) is a self-bred three-year-old gelding in Chess Racing's distinctive checkered dress. The gelding made his debut in November 2022, finishing second to Footfall in a short 1200-meter race at the home track before going into winter rest. The three-year-old campaign has been a true tour de force, with victories in Jägersros Triple Crown series, the Voter Race, the Swedish Derby, and the Hurricane Race, all achieved in a completely dominant style. The first start on grass in the Stockholm Cup is, of course, a concern, but Jessica Long's training has done a satisfactory job on Klampenborg's turf ahead of the Cup. The top choice.

8. HARD ONE TO PLEASE (IRE)





Hard One To Please (by Fast Company) started three times as a two-year-old on the Øvrevoll turf over a mile, resulting in a victory in a maiden race. The gelding, who barely made it into the Swedish Derby, had a decidedly tough seasonal debut. A change in distance, a new surface, and formidable competition made it quite challenging. The rest is racing history. The chestnut colt surprised everyone by winning the Swedish Derby, followed it up with a dominant victory in the Norwegian Derby, and rounded off the season with a triumph in the current Stockholm Cup. Most recently, he clinched a victory in the Marit Sveaas Memorial and will be ridden on this special day by the legendary Frankie Dettori during his The Farewell Tour.







Stroxx Carlras (by Footstepsinthesand) is one out of trainer Rikke Rohbach Bonde's two participants in the Cup, and since the stable's first jockey, Nicolaj Stott, has chosen to ride Go On Carlras, it is highly likely that Stroxx Carlras is considered the second choice for Stald Ras. The five-year-old concluded a brilliant three-year-old campaign with a surprising victory in the Swedish Derby, followed by wins in the Norwegian Derby and the Mischa Kahn Memorial Race. He continued to show good form in his seasonal debut, finishing second to top miler Duca di Como in the Pramms Memorial (L), only a few lengths behind, which earned him a rating of 94. However, he has not stood out since then and the chances are extremely difficult to predict in this Cup, especially since it's his seasonal debut.

Outbox (by Frankel) is a well-bred globetrotter whose most notable achievement, at least in terms of earnings, is his victory in a local Group 1 race in Qatar in 2022, which was worth over five million SEK. From a sporting perspective, he also secured a win in the Fred Archer Stakes (L) in 2021, a race in which the Archie Watson-trained horse finished second earlier that year. The gelding was clearly second best to Square de Luynes in the Cup in 2021, only to finish second again last year to Hard One To Please, narrowly beaten after an aggressive ride from an outer position. His current form may be somewhat hard to predict, but he should benefit from facing a less competitive field this year.
