- 1. KORNELIA BELLA Disappointing on the whole for over 2 years and has no possible chance on monte debut
- 2. **KETMIE DE BABEL** Lost her way under harness in late-spring and makes her ridden bow with little to no chance of finishing in the mix
- **3. KALIST DES LANDES -** Modest element with nothing to show for his harness efforts and is unlikely to make any waves on monte bow
- **4. KING DU PLESSIS -** Lost her action on monte debut at Nantes on 5 November. Remains shod and will struggle to make his presence felt
- **5. KODIAC DE GUEZ -** Showed promise under the saddle last year but has looked ordinary in both codes since and cannot be considered a player
- **6. KECILPOSTE** Capable but unexceptional mare in the ridden code. Has 3 runs in her since the break, races barefoot for the first time under the saddle, and will generate some interest
- **7. KOBALT GAGOU -** Pleased during the spring and early-summer but has been off the boil for some time and can be passed over
- **8. KAROLE DE VAL -** Monte debutante returning to racing shod after being eliminated on reentry earlier in the month. Starts on front line but others still preferred
- **9. KOMETE DE VAL -** Hardy mare making first appearance since early-September, but secured both monte successes with Clement Frecelle, and starting in front will only work in her favour
- **10. KATE DE LA MOTTE -** Debuts in the discipline after being eliminated at Cabourg. Is not without merit but at this level will have too much to do
- **11. KOKTAIL DE JANZE -** Significantly better than his recent Saint-Brieuc run would suggest. Was never at his ease that day, but is a tough nut to crack when focused and can make a big impact

- **16. KERIDA PHEDO -** Failed to confirm Vincennes effort when trounced at Vire earlier in the month. Reverts to a previous formula but still not an obvious choice

- **17. KAMIKAZE** Useful sort with one race in him since his re-entry earlier in the month. Races barefoot for Meslay debut and the engagement will do his prospects no disservice
- **18. KANDISSIME -** Quality element with nothing to prove at this level but starts for first time in 12 months. Is never far from faulting but sports a new configuration and Stephane Meunier could not have wished for a better entry

Summary: Very hard to fault when barefoot and focused, KRUNCH DE L'ITON (15) returns to racing right-handed after producing a good performance at Le Croise-Laroche, and with Eric Raffin in the saddle this time can make this his own. KARAMEL JOYEUX (12) is seen more often than not in the harness code, but presents solid ridden references and with Benjamin Rochard riding will be expected to contest the finish. KOKTAIL DE JANZE (11) has a pair of runs under his belt since the layoff and looks competitive for a place in the frame. KITENA (13) should also be fit by now and returns to racing barefoot.

- **2. MILORD DE TERNOIRE -** Respectable type that pleasantly surprised when 5th of 16 in a 2350m Angers Class F 10 days ago, although a repeat seems most unlikely
- **3. MADDALENA JEEP -** Put away after opening her account on turf at first time of asking. Returned last month to run 3rd in a Chateaubriant Class F conditioner, will have progressed for the run, and has a reasonable chance of making first 5
- **4. MILTON DREAM -** Pleased twice at Cherbourg before being trounced at Vire earlier in the month and is not about to spice things up
- **5. MISTER DU LOISIR -** Tricky character that was going well when eliminated at Nantes early this month. Franck Nivard at the helm this time and must not be underestimated
- **6. MADY DU POMMEREUX -** Useful but erratic filly that would have finished closer at Vire last month had she been more sure of stride, but form is not in question and with application can pick up some prizemoney
- **7. MELVIANA -** Won her race in August and then put away the following month. Has not been seen since and will be race-rusty
- **8. MARQUIS LA MAZURE -** Won a Class G over course and distance before running a decent 5th at Laval 11 days ago. Is plainly in fine form and will be expected to apply the pressure on MENTOR DE VILLABON (13)

- **2. JOKE DU HOUSSEL -** In the frame in last 4 starts and has solid right-handed references. Is new to Meslay but in current condition is easy to like for a spot in the money
- **3. HOLD UP IDEF** Switches back to the monte code after some mediocre performances in the amateur division. Presents decent credentials but at this level will have his work cut out
- **4. JUST ME NESLE -** Quality trotter with excellent monte credentials. Is new to Meslay-du-Maine but will not be far off the mark if he stays in stride
- **5. INTREPIDE NEMO -** Was in excellent shape earlier in the year but lost his way in late-spring and has done nothing to reassure since

Barring his latest effort at Vire, IDEAL DE CHAHAINS (7) is like a horse reborn and even though reconfigured is unlikely to disappoint. Although eliminated in his last 2, JUST ME NESLE (4) has talent in spades and will have a lot to contribute if his apprentice keeps him focused.

- **3. LOLA DE CHENU -** Makes Meslay bow after running 2nd in a 3000m Nantes Class E on 1 December. Will not be available at 103-1 this time but is unlikely to be as performant either
- **4. LOKA LOKA -** Goes barefoot for first time after running 2nd of 15 in a 2050m Laval Class F 11 days ago. Is ideally-placed on front line and can make a big splash if she keeps her action together

- **6. LUNOA D'ECHAL** Like a horse transformed since starting to race barefoot. Returns to the harness game after failing to deliver under the saddle at Vincennes on 5 December. Is unbeaten in 2 starts with Franck Nivard and will have her chances
- **7. LAURIANE DU RIED -** Unexceptional filly back in the discipline after being eliminated under the saddle at Angers 10 days ago. Pleased twice last month but is being aimed too high this time
- **8. LEGION SMART -** Hardy filly with a pair of conditioners under her belt since the autumn break. Is unlikely to open her Meslay account but will be fully-fit by now and can pick up a cheque if Thomas Constans defies the draw
- **9. LOVELY BRUYERE -** Complicated filly that has been struggling since the autumn. Is new to the venue, has been handed a rough draw, and chances appear limited

- **4. JAGER BOUMBOUM -** Sprang an 84-1 surprise when 5th behind JASMIN GEMA (16) in a Chateaubriant Class E 2.5 weeks ago, however a repeat seems most improbable

- **10. JERICHO DU RIB** Faithful campaigner with solid references at this level. Does not have it all in her favour this time but still has the wherewithal to contest the finish
- **11. JUSTE SNOB -** Back under harness after 2 fine performances in the ridden code. Shoes on this time though and a minor place chance at best
- **12. INKY PERRINE** A disappointment in both disciplines in 2025 and races here with nothing to offer

Summary: Somewhat disappointing in late-summer, JOKER GEMA (2) has started to come good again, enjoys a decent spot on the front row, and has never been defeated here. Benjamin Rochard will be keen to keep that fact relevant but will still be wary of JOOST D'OLERON (3) who will be fully-fit by now, and the in-form JERICHO DU RIB (10) who, despite a 2nd row draw and a less-performant formula, should not be underestimated. Robin Lamy simply thrives with JUDY MATIDY (9) and in spite of the draw still looks competitively well in.
