- **1. KALIKA DU LEVANT -** Returns to a previous configuration after easily winning a 2800m Cholet Class F late last month. Anthony Barrier in the bike this time and has a realistic chance of finishing close
- **2. KARA DE PIERREPONT -** It took some time but returned to winning ways in a 2875m Meslay Class E 2.5 weeks ago. Benjamin Rochard stays faithful and while unlikely to repeat is not one to be ruled out either
- **3. KOREA -** Back under harness after finishing last of 9 in a 2800m Cholet monte Class E late last month. Barefoot for the occasion but still not an obvious choice
- **4. KALMIA BOSS -** Has taken her game to a new level this year, latterly 2nd of 10 to KARA DE PIERREPONT (2) in a 2875m Meslay Class E 2.5 weeks ago. Should take well to Le Mans profile and can expect the lion's share of support
- **5. KALY D'EOLE -** Sanctioned in a 2750m Ecommoy Class E 11 days ago. Is not entirely without merit but others still preferred
- **6. KANELLE STAR -** 5th of 8 in a 2700m Vincennes Class E on 3 May. Is plainly headed in the right direction and, shod once again, must be respected
- **7. KOTKITA GIRL -** Lost her action when heavily-backed in a 2575m Saint-Brieuc Class E on 2 May. Form is not in doubt though, has never failed to deliver at Le Mans, and must be considered a serious player
- **8. KALINKA DU BREUIL -** Comfortable winner of a 2900m Amiens Class E early last month. Comes here fresh but may just be taking on too much
- **9. KASTA DU RIB -** Ran 4th at Cherbourg last month prior to coming 2nd of 11 in a 2150m Argentan Class E 10 days ago. Can prove a handful but is confirmed here and has a decent chance of making first 5
- **10. KELLISIA GIRL -** Would have finished closer than 4th in a 2175m Vincennes Class E on 11 April had she not faulted. Is clearly in top form and can challenge for the win if she stays in stride
- **11. KHALEESI LA VIE -** Encouraging 4th of 16 in a 2800m Rambouillet Class E on 11 May. Will appreciate the return to a hard surface and is worth keeping an eye on
- **12. KAPELLA -** Sanctioned on return to competition in a 2800m Rambouillet Class E 2.5 weeks ago and is unlikely to generate much interest
- **13. KORIGANE D'ERABLE -** 3rd of 7 in a 2575m Saint-Brieuc Class E 3 weeks ago. Has no left-handed references and in this company will struggle to make her mark
- **14. KINOU DAB -** Has 2 races under her belt since the spell, latterly last of 12 in a 2100m Vincennes Class E last week. Will be fully fit by now, enjoys a fine entry, and Damien Bonne will be eager to take advantage of the race conditions

Summary: In excellent shape and shod as she was when victorious at Laval, KALMIA BOSS (4) will be reined by Matthieu Abrivard for the first time and has every chance of imposing. Yves Dreux is double-handed though with KELLISIA GIRL (10) who is a tough nut when barefoot and focused, and KOTKITA GIRL (7) who should not be too hastily-judged for faulting at Saint-Brieuc. Late last month, KALIKA DU LEVANT (1) won her first race for over a year and even with front pads fitted this time, is unlikely to disappoint.

- **2. KAIROUAN GLAM -** Has not raced since winning a 3250m Saumur Class F on 20 March. Is not cut out for this level of competition and best to keep one's powder dry
- **3. KRICK DE CONDE -** Won 2 of last 3, latterly dominating a 2800m Cholet Class F on 28 April. Takes a hike up the category-ladder however and chances appear limited
- **4. KILOU -** 2nd of 13 in a 2400m Amiens Class E on 3 May. Is pitted against a superior lot this time and others preferred
- **5. KANAK DU BOCAGE -** Reverts to racing with front pads fitted after being sanctioned in a 2750m Ecommoy Class E 11 days ago. Can trot but in this category will have too much to do
- **6. KASH PRIDE -** Unable to confirm Alencon success when sanctioned in a 2700m Cluny Class E 2 weeks ago. Is never far from springing a surprise though and will have his supporters
- **7. KINO DE LAUMIERE -** 6th of 11 behind KARATE KING (14) in a 2700m Vincennes Class E on 2 May. Stays shod for the occasion but in current condition is easy to like for a minor place cheque
- **8. KROSS FINGERS -** 3rd at Maure-de-Bretagne but failed to confirm when 7th of 11 finishers in a 2800m Rambouillet Class E 2.5 weeks ago. Is back on a hard surface, will be fully race-fit, and should not be far off the mark
- **9. KARMA TEJY -** Raced respectably in Paris before finishing 7th of 14 behind KASSOUMAYE (12) in a 2750m Ecommoy Class E on 11 May. Has otherwise been in fine fettle and has a realistic chance of making first 5
- **10. KLEMS DE JAVIE -** Honest type that ran 5th of 10 in a 2575m Saint-Brieuc Class E on 2 May. Is unlikely to get his nose in front but can nevertheless get a look-in
- **11. KER DE TOUES -** Ran 2nd at Nancy before coming 5th of 11 in a 2875m Enghien Class D on 19 April. Trainer/driver could not have wished for a better entry and will be determined to strike while the iron is hot
- **12. KASSOUMAYE -** Reassuring 3rd of 14 in a 2750m Ecommoy Class E 11 days ago. Is not everyone's cup of tea but with Benjamin Rochard in the bike again, will be assured a competitive drive
- **13. KANDINSKY -** Last but one on comeback in a 2825m Chartres Class D on 27 April. Still in conditioning mode and can be passed over
- **14. KARATE KING -** 4th of 11 in a 2700m Vincennes Class E on 2 May. Faces a less-exalted lot this time and can challenge for the win

Summary: Difficult to knock when focused and unshod, KACI DU LUPIN (1) made no bones about imposing at Maure-de-Bretagne a month back and in similar shape will be expected to repeat. Convincing at Vincennes recently, and wonderfully-engaged, KARATE KING (14) returns to the provinces with a good hand to play. KER DE TOUES (11) has been holding his own lately and a repeat of his latest effort should see him competitive for a spot on the podium. KROSS FINGERS (8) may not be the most reliable of horses but when focused is no pushover.

- **2. JUMBY BAY -** Reassured at Le Croise-Laroche before finishing 8th of 10 in a 2700m Graignes Class E on 13 April. Reverts to a previous configuration and should figure prominently at the business end of the race
- **3. JUSTE DU GERS -** Sports 4 pads for first time after winning a 2825m Durtal Class E last Sunday. Is a hardy mare when focused and looks main threat to JULIE DU CLOS (12)
- **4. JEEDAYA DU VIVIER -** Faces first objective of new season after coming 8th of 17 in a 2800m Cholet Class E last week. Is not easy to fault in the day's configuration and despite the hike in category should not be overlooked
- **5. JADE HERINIERE -** Unremarkable 7th of 11 behind JULIE DU CLOS (12) in a 2700m Vincennes Class D 3 weeks ago. Has looked rather ordinary of late and chances slim
- **6. JOY DU CARNOIS -** Going well when sanctioned in a 2700m Vincennes Class D on 2 May. Races barefoot for first time and with application could pleasantly surprise
- **7. JOY DU RIF Makes first appearance since finishing 11th of 13 behind JADE HERINIERE (5)** in a 2800m Rambouillet Class E on 30 March and can expect to have few friends
- **8. JASMINE DE JYR -** Close 2nd of 16 in a 2825m Chartres Class E on 7 May. In better company this time but in present form is easy to recommend for a first-5 cheque
- **9. JULIA BELLA -** Sanctioned at Cholet before finishing last of 10 in a 3225m Vitre Class E on 27 April. Is significantly better than that, is confirmed at the venue, and must be considered a major player
- **10. JALMAROSA -** Last of 11 when preparing for this in a 2150m Argentan Class F 10 days ago. Front shoes off this time but others still preferred
- **11. JUNE D'ERABLE -** Ran good 3rd at Lisieux but below-par 7th of 16 in a 2700m Graignes Class F 3 weeks ago. Returns to racing barefoot and given the stable's form, must be afforded respect

Summary: Enjoying something of a resurgence this year, JULIE DU CLOS (12) is shod as she was when imposing twice this term and can add another victory to her 2025 tally. Solid as a rock at Durtal, JUSTE DU GERS (3) sports 4 pads for the first time and steps back up in category with a lot to offer. Arguably better when barefoot, JULIA BELLA (9) should nevertheless not be condemned for her last 2 runs and, winner here last summer, must be taken very seriously indeed. JOSEPHA CHOUP (13) consistently gives everything she has and is shod to preference for her Le Mans debut.

- **2. JOCKEY -** Not once out of first 5 in as many starts this year, latterly 5th of 10 in a 2450m Caen Class D 2.5 weeks ago. Is being aimed higher this time but sports front pads and should nevertheless hold his own
- **3. JAGERBOMB -** Climbs the category-ladder after running 2nd of 14 in a 3200m Fougeres Class E 3 weeks ago and can expect to have few friends
- **4. JET DES MALBERAUX -** Won 2 of 3 before being sanctioned in a 2700m Meral amateurs Class H on 11 May. Takes a hike in category and even though reconfigured is not about to cause an upset
- **5. JOSHUA PEJI -** Has not been seen out since being sanctioned in a 2700m Vincennes Class C late-December. Is barefoot for re-entry and with application could spring a small surprise
- **6. JORLANDO -** Failed to confirm Rambouillet victory when sanctioned in a 2700m Vincennes Class D on 29 April. Has otherwise been enjoying a fine run of form and Alexandre Abrivard will be keen to put things right
- **7. JAMES MADRIK -** In the frame in 2 return runs, latterly 3rd of 15 behind JUST FOR FUN (11) in a 2800m Cholet Class E on 28 April. Should be at peak fitness by now and can bring the fight to JUST D'ACADIE (12)
- **8. JEWEL D'HERMES -** Last of 14 in a 2800m Cholet Class E last week. Has other priorities and can be ruled out

- **4. L'AS DE SMARVES -** Runner-up in 2 of last 3, latterly a 2800m Vichy Class E on 11 May. Appreciates these conditions and will be no easy touch
- **5. LEADER DE L'AUMOY -** Sanctioned in last 3, latterly a 2850m Vincennes claimer 9 days ago, and even though reconfigured others are still easier to back

- **10. MALAVISTA SOMOLLI -** Sanctioned, on first start since the spell, in a 2800m Chartres Class E on 7 May and is not about to shake things up
- **11. MISS LOVE BERRY -** Won a 2000m Rambouillet Class F 2.5 weeks ago. Back on a hard surface and looks no more than a minor place prospect
- **12. MA BELLA DE JED -** Last but one in a 2400m Nort-sur-Erdre Class E on 8 May. Has never delivered going left-handed and is not about to break the mould
- **13. MUNIA -** Comfortably won a 2700m Graignes Class F on comeback in early-April. Makes Le Mans bow with morale intact and will be expected to contest the finish
- **14. MALIKA DU SURF -** Disappointing 5th of 6 finishers in a 2575m Saint-Brieuc Class E on 2 May and has a lot more to find

Summary: A winner a month back at the first time of asking, MILADY DE LA PIECE (4) goes left-handed on this occasion but looks a progressive sort and has a realistic chance of staying undefeated. He will still come under fire from MY DARLING DU RIS (8) who pleasantly surprised at Laval last month, and the interesting Philippe Allaire-trained MUNIA (13) who got off the mark at Graignes on her first start since last summer. MANDARINA DE LOU (2) faces a stiffer test than she did at Laon but has the look of a good horse in the making and must be respected.
