- **1. IBIS PETTEVINIERE -** 3rd of 16 to HOLD UP DREAM (4) in a 2850m Laval Class D a fortnight back. Has solid references over track and trip and is not one to be overlooked
- **2. INSTRUCTOR -** In the frame in 2 of last 3, latterly 2nd of 16 in a 2850m Laon Class E on 1 May. Is proven under these conditions and is not about to disappoint
- **3. INDIGO PIERJI -** Sports a new formula after finishing 10th of 14 in a 2850m Class D here 3 weeks ago. Is considerably better than recent numbers would suggest and must be respected
- **4. HOLD UP DREAM -** Got back in the game 2 weeks ago when successful in a 2850m Laval Class D but in this company will have little to contribute
- **5. ICARE DE PHYT'S -** 8th of 11 in a 2850m Class D here 3 weeks ago. Has done little of note this year and with hind shoes back on will have little to offer
- **6. HOLD UP RANAIS -** Capable on a good day but will need to improve on latest 6th of 11 in a 2100m Class C here 2 weeks ago
- **7. IN LOVE DE JIEL -** Surprisingly sanctioned in a 2800m Strasbourg Class D mid-month. Always gives his best though, is plainly in shape, and has a reasonable chance of making first 5
- **8. HAUTBRION COLMI -** Undeniably useful but sanctioned in last 2, latterly a 2850m Class D here 3 weeks ago, and others easier to trust
- **9. IN RED -** 12th of 14 behind INDIGO PIERJI (3) in a 2850m Class D here 3 weeks ago. Won last 4 when sporting the day's formula and again looks a serious proposition
- **10. HISA DU MARGAS** Out of the picture in last 2, most recently 8th of 11 in a 2850m Class D here 3 weeks ago, and can be ruled out

Reunited with Eric Raffin who won with him in January, the ideally-engaged IACYNTHE DIDJEAP (16) is barefoot following his mid-month conditioner and is not incapable of getting straight down to business. Never disappointing in the day's configuration, IN RED (9) will be fully fit by now. INDIGO PIERJI (3) has yet to deliver for Matthieu Abrivard but racing with front shoes off could well make all the difference.

- **3. DIABEL -** Sanctioned early when preparing for this in a 2875m Enghien Class D on 17 April. Has yet to disappoint when barefoot at Vincennes and, winner last time under these conditions, will not be far off the mark
- **4. VALLATONIAN -** 2nd of 13 in a Class D over course and distance on 18 April. Comes here fresh and looks set to continue his competitive ways
- **5. KISS ME HONEY -** 4th of 10 on comeback in a 3000m Marseille-Borély Class C 2 weeks ago. Takes on a better lot here though and not an obvious choice
- **6. HASHTAG SIMONI -** Raced better in a 2100m Class C here mid-month than his 5th of 16 would suggest. Eric Raffin maintains faith and will be expected to make the frame this time
- **7. KARBONE CASH -** Has not been seen out since running 6th of 14 in a 2875m Argentan Class A last November and has nothing to offer
- **8. KORONA DELADOU -** Pleased in last 2, latterly 2nd of 13 in a 2850m Maure-de-Bretagne Class C on 23 April, but represents no more than a minor place prospect
- **9. KALINE DE VIVOIN -** Finished last of 5 in a 2850m monte Gr.2 here on 25 April and will have other priorities

Enjoying something of a renaissance, VALLATONIAN (4) will be competitive for a place on the podium.

- 2. LAST QUEEN Tricky filly that ran 9th of 10 finishers behind LUTIN JABA (10) when being conditioned in a Class B over course and distance on 14 May. Shod to preference and must be afforded respect
- **3. LOBBING DE BLARY -** Fast-finishing 5th of 14 in a Class B over course and distance 3.5 weeks ago, despite enduring a tough trip, and has the wherewithal to challenge for a place in the frame this time
- **4. LOTUS GRIFF -** Out of the picture in last 3, latterly sanctioned in 14 May race of reference, and others easier to back
- **5. LAMONT DU DOUET -** Sanctioned after having been denied a run in a Class B under these conditions on 14 May. Showed his form that day and in similar shape could pleasantly surprise
- **6. LEONARDO VICI -** Classy type that demolished a 2475m Royan Class C on 4 May but would be preferred competitively shod
- **7. LOUIS VITTON MIJO -** Made it 2 on the trot last Sunday when dominating a Class C under these conditions. Is a veritable steamroller when barefoot and will not be easy to oppose

- **5. IZNOGOUD AM -** Starts for first time since finishing 9th of 11 in a 2100m Class A here in early-February. Has proven form in superior company and with application can open his French account

- **3. LAKANA DE FELLIERE -** Good, consistent filly that came 4th of 10 finishers in a Class C over course and distance 10 days ago but faces a very stiff test this time
- **4. LEONARDO DE LOU -** Made it 2 in a row when winning a 2175m Class D here on 6 May but the step up in category looks a step too far
- **5. L'ECRIN D'OR -** Won over course and distance first time under the saddle before losing his action in Gr.2 Prix René Palyart. Shoes back on though and Alexandre Abrivard will be keen to put things right
- **6. LAMBADA DU GOUTIER -** Sanctioned in all 4 this year, most recently 2450m Gr.2 Prix Henri Ballière at Caen 3 weeks ago. Sports 4 pads this time but others still easier to trust
- **7. LOCHAN -** Pleasantly surprising 3rd of 14 to LITTLE ORELIE (16) in 2450m Gr.2 Prix Henri Ballière at Caen 3 weeks ago, but confirmation seems unlikely
- **8. LE VOYOU D'ALMO -** 5th of 7 finishers to LOOPING DAY (12) in 2175m Gr.2 Prix René Palyart here on 25 April and is unlikely to trouble the judge
- **9. LISBONNE DRY -** In the frame in 4 straight before faulting in the race of reference. Showed her form that day though and, barefoot for the occasion, should not disappoint
- **10. LARA DU LERRE -** Has gone from strength to strength this term, latterly 2nd of 14 to LITTLE ORELIE (16) in 2450m Gr.2 Prix Henri Ballière at Caen 3 weeks ago. Has never disappointed when barefoot and although not a priority, must be retained

- **4. GREAT ROCK -** 5th of 18 when preparing for this in a 2800m Vire Class F 11 days ago. Has otherwise been in flying form, appreciates the main track, and must be considered a contender
- **5. HUGO DU BOURG -** Steps back up in category after running 6th of 11 in a 2700m claimer here a month ago and will have few friends
- **6. FERVENTE -** 15th of 18 behind HIP HOP DE MADKER (12) in a 2950m Le Mans Class E on 8 May, on first start since October. Barefoot this time and although not a priority should not be entirely overlooked

- **10. LATINO AU CROSNIER -** Made short work of a 2800m Bernay Class E on 1 May, his first start for 5 months. Has previously imposed here for Robin Lamy and can do so again
- **11. LATHOS DE VIVOIN -** Makes first start since running 4th of 8 finishers in a 2100m Class D here on 7 February. Enjoys a good entry though and, reconfigured with Eric Raffin reining, must not be underestimated
- **12. LOTUS DE BEYLEV -** Won over 2200m at Caen before coming 7th of 17 in a 2875m Argentan Class E on 14 April. Goes left-handed for first time, is ideally-engaged, and looks a serious proposition

**Summary:** In form and by no means disgraced on his main-track debut mid-month, LUCIANO VREDEBEST (2) will be expected to continue his forward march and win this. He will still encounter resistance from the progressive LOIR ET CHER (7) who left a good impression here last month, and Vincennes debutant LOTUS DE BEYLEV (12) who imposed at Caen on his penultimate outing. LATINO AU CROSNIER (10) got straight back in the game earlier in the month, on his first start since December, and will have a legitimate claim on a place in the frame.
