C1 - PRIX DE CHAUDES AIGUES - 2875m (a2m) - Class D Race - Mounted - EUR € 40,000

- **1. LYNX ATOUT -** Surprise 4th of 7 finishers in a 2750m Cabourg Class D mid-July, and a repeat seems most improbable
- **2. LOVI CADENCE -** Eliminated in a 2250m Class C here a fortnight back. Not the most generous of trotters and is unlikely to spring any surprises
- **3. LUCAS DE TOURNAI -** Eliminated, on first appearance since April, in a 2725m Cabourg Class D on 22 July. Will have come on for the run, has never disappointed at Enghien, and will not be leaving empty-handed
- **4. LUCIA PERRINE -** Would have finished 4th of 8 finishers in a 2250m Class C here a fortnight back had she not faulted mid-straight. That notwithstanding, others still easier to back
- **5. LOUVE ANGEL -** 5th of 8 finishers in a 2250m Class C here a fortnight back. Is not about to get her nose in front but is still competitive for a first-5 cheque
- **6. LITTLE DAIDOU -** Lost all chance after faulting, subsequently coming last of 5, in a 2625m Class F at La Rochelle last Monday. Is plainly in shape, should take well to Enghien profile, and can go close if he gets off on the right foot
- **7. LEMON FLEURY -** Eliminated in both starts since the spring break, most recently a Class D over track and trip on 17 July. Showed his form last time though and Mathieu Mottier will be expecting to win this
- **8. LEVADIA** 6th of 8 finishers, a place behind LOUVE ANGEL (5), in a 2250m Class C here a fortnight back. Will appreciate the return to a longer trip and has a decent chance of trotting her way into the picture
- **9. LABEL DE TILLARD -** Last of 8, on first start since the spell, in a harness Class C over course and distance 10 days ago. Will have progressed for the run, is barefoot for first time at Enghien, and with application will be competitive
- **10. LADY QUEEN -** Debuts in the discipline after running 7th of 10 finishers in a harness Class C under these conditions 2 weeks ago. Is reconfigured, with Benjamin Rochard aboard, but others still preferred
- **11. LEONCE DU CLOS** Has not been seen out since finishing last but one in a 2700m Vincennes Gr.3 on 1 February. Is competitively-shod but is going to need the run

Summary: Decidedly capricious under harness, LEMON FLEURY (7) has nevertheless shown significant ability and even though shod, can make his ridden bow a winning one. LABEL DE TILLARD (9) is not the easiest to handle either but he goes barefoot for his first objective of the summer and can make a big impact if Romain Marty keeps him focused. LEVADIA (8) drops to a more reasonable level, while LITTLE DAIDOU (6) will be no pushover if applied.

- 1. MAESTRO DU CHOQUEL 2nd to MOUFFETARD (3) at La Capelle before comfortably winning a 2150m Class E here on 10 July. Unlikely to double his money but still looks the main threat
- **2. MAGNUS MAXIMUS -** Last of 8 finishers, on first start for new trainer, in a Class C under these conditions a month back, having been bought out of a claimer. Takes on too much this time and chances limited
- **3. MOUFFETARD -** Made it 3 in a row when flying up in a 2700m Class D at La Capelle on 6 July. Steps up in category but still has the measure of the field
- **4. MISTER BARRA** Disappointing in last 2, latterly last of 11 behind MAXOU DES IFS (6) in a 2800m Bernay Class B last weekend, and can expect to remain friendless in the markets
- **5. MEA CULPA -** Takes a notable step up in category after running 3rd of 11 in a claimer over course and distance on 26 June and will need to show markedly more
- **6. MAXOU DES IFS -** Ran 4th over course and distance a month back before repeating in a 2800m Bernay Class B last weekend. Is not about to have his day in the sun but can still compete for a place in the frame
- **7. MIKADO GEDE** Found his way over 2150m here in late-June, winning a Class D in good order. Returns with morale intact and will be expected to play an active role once more
- **8. MILORD D'IRAI -** Never threatening when eliminated in a 2150m Class C here 3 weeks ago and has no possible chance

Summary: MOUFFETARD (3) has progressed for each run since his debut elimination and makes his metropolitan bow with every chance of pulling off the 4-timer. MAESTRO DU CHOQUEL (1) however, has gone from strength to strength and last month's 2150m victory here will stand him in good stead. MIKADO GEDE (7) lost his maiden status here in late-June and even though stepping up in category still has a good hand to play. MAXOU DES IFS (6) is not about to get off the mark but a repeat of his Bernay effort would see him pick up another cheque.

- **1. KOUSINE MAJYC -** Would have completed the hat-trick had she not finished 2nd of 16 in a 2900m Clairefontaine harness Class H a fortnight ago. Goes left-handed under the saddle this time but will be no pushover if applied
- **2. ERGA OMNES PAR -** Tricky character that finished last of 12 in a 2850m Vincennes harness Class D on 20 June, and has no possible chance
- **3. ETOILE DU OZ -** 6th of 7 in a 2875m harness Class E here a week ago and is clearly out of her depth
- **4. KENJI D'AUBERVILLE -** Eliminated on re-entry 2 weeks ago in a 2850m Carentan harness Class F. Shoes off but looks a race shy
- **5. KALONEK DU MONT -** Out of the picture in last 3, most recently 8th of 11 in a 2675m Class E at Le Mont-Saint-Michel on 30 June, and is not about to create an upset
- **6. KALISTA JIEL -** 7th of 9 in a 2700m harness Class E at La Capelle 12 days ago. Imposed over course and distance 12 months ago and, with hind shoes off this time, must be taken seriously
- **7. KIDY D'EPONA -** Last but one when preparing for this in a 2875m harness Class E here 10 days ago. Is plainly in fine shape and will have a lot to offer if Benjamin Rochard keeps her trotting
- **8. KARLSON PASS -** 6th of 9 when prepping for this in a 2200m Le Mans harness Class D 2.5 weeks ago. Runs barefoot, in her preferred discipline, and is unlikely to be far from the action
- **9. KING DE PLAY -** Last of 12 on comeback in a 2525m harness Class D at Les Andelys mid-June. Has been reconfigured for the occasion but still no more than a minor place chance
- **10. KILL AND KISS** 6th of 14 in a Class C under these conditions on 5 July. In a less-exalted bunch here and will have a reasonable chance of making the frame
- **11. KATCHINA FOR CLARA -** Made amends for Vincennes elimination when flying up in a 2225m Feurs Class D a month ago. Enjoys a superb entry and on good behaviour can make this her own

Summary: Winner of 2 of her last 3, KATCHINA FOR CLARA (11) imposed so well at Feurs that it is hard to see her being beaten here. 169/1 winner under harness at Cabourg before continuing her conditioning here recently, KIDY D'EPONA (7) is back in her code of preference, sporting a fresh configuration, and with application should represent the main threat. KOUSINE MAJYC (1) gets another crack at the ridden code after an excellent session under harness and the revised formula should only help matters. Better than his recent effort would suggest, KILL AND KISS (10) will be more competitive at this level.

- **2. KENZA SUPREME -** 5th of 14 behind KALINKA DU GRENAT (7) in a Class E under these conditions 10 days ago. Reliability not her strong suit though and represents no more than a minor place prospect
- **3. KOPA D'ARC -** 5th of 8 finishers in a 2900m Clairefontaine Class E 3 weeks ago. Is significantly better than that and the new configuration may be just what the doctor ordered
- **4. KARMA TEJY -** Reassuring 2nd of 13 in a Class E under these conditions on 17 July. Looks close to his race and should prove main threat to KANSAS QUESNOT (10)
- **5. KALINE DE FAEL -** Quality mare starting for first time since coming 8th of 16 in a 2700m Vincennes Class D last January. Shoes on and others preferred
- **6. KRISTO BOURBON -** Sanctioned, on return from a spell, in a 2625m Cherbourg Class E on 17 July, and appears to have no realistic chance
- **7. KALINKA DU GRENAT -** Has done nothing but improve lately, lastly 2nd of 14 in a Class E under these conditions 10 days ago. Is preferred a level down but sports 4 pads this time and could yet return home with a first-5 cheque
- **8. KNOCK OUT -** Eliminated in 3 of last 4, most recently a 2750m Cabourg Class D 8 days ago. Has form here but other more trustworthy options available
- **9. KING FROMENTRO -** 3rd of 13, a place behind KARMA TEJY (4), in a Class E under these conditions on 17 July. Has not won for 2 years but is always game and can again make the frame
- **10. KANSAS QUESNOT -** Missed out on the hat-trick when beaten by KROSS FINGERS (11) in a 2750m Class E at La Capelle 3 weeks ago. Is as versatile as they come and Pierre-Yves Verva will be determined to set the record straight
- **11. KROSS FINGERS -** Won 2 of last 3, latterly a 2750m Class E at La Capelle 3 weeks ago. Unlikely to impose but nonetheless has the wherewithal to finish in the mix
- **12. KARA D'OR -** Back under harness after being eliminated in a 2250m monte Class C conditioner here early last month. Runs barefoot, benefits from a terrific entry, and even against the boys must be taken seriously

Summary: Surprisingly beaten at La Capelle when expected to complete the hat-trick, KANSAS QUESNOT (10) is nevertheless in the form of his life and can wrap this up if he takes to the new conditions. That being said, KARMA TEJY (4) and KING FROMENTRO (9) ran respectively 2nd and 3rd here last month and both look competitive once more. KOPA D'ARC (3) has not been as sharp as he was during the spring but Nicolas Bridault has fitted him with pads for the first time which should see him back in business.

- **2. JUST D'ACADIE -** Eliminated in last 2, most recently a 2150m Class F here 10 days ago. Yoann Lebourgeois stays faithful though and should not be ignored
- **3. JOB DU PERSIL -** Oddly below-par 7th of 10 in a 2750m Class D at La Capelle 12 days ago. Is confirmed here and the engagement of Franck Ouvrie will do his chances no disservice
- **4. JANNIG D'EREVAN -** Imposed at Caen before coming 3rd of 14, a place behind JAMAIS (7), in a Class D over track and trip on 12 July, and with form maintained should again finish close
- **5. JERICHO VEDAQUAIS** Has won 3 of last 4, latterly a 2650m Class E at Les Sables-d'Olonne with consummate ease on 9 July, and will have a lot to contribute over this even surface
- **6. IMAKER** Wonderfully-consistent type that comfortably won a 2900m Amiens Class F on 10 July. At this level though will have too much to do
- **7. JAMAIS -** Left quite the impression when close 2nd of 14 in a Class D over track and trip on 12 July. Is plainly close to his race and Benjamin Rochard can be justifiably confident. Claim
- **8. JETPACK -** Reassured late-June before running 4th of 11 in a 2675m Guer-Coëtquidan Class F on 14 July. Franck Nivard in the bike this time and will have his supporters
- **9. JOPLIN DES CROUAS -** No slouch on a good day but sanctioned in 4 of last 5, latterly a 3150m Class E at La Roche-Posay a fortnight ago, and others easier to trust
- **10. JERICHO DU RIB -** Fast-finishing 2nd of 10 in a 2850m Class D across town in late-June. Comes here fresh, has already won here, and must be considered a contender

Summary: In excellent condition and eye-catching here 3 weeks ago, JAMAIS (7) is easy to fancy for the win this time. JANNIG D'EREVAN (4) followed him in that day and, given his form, should again figure prominently, as should the well-engaged JERICHO DU RIB (10) who has proved dynamic when barefoot. JERICHO VEDAQUAIS (5) is like a horse reborn and should take well to Enghien conditions.

- **2. LOTUS DE BEYLEV -** Surprise 2nd of 13 in a 2150m Class D here on 5 July. Has shown signs of a possible resurgence and deserves to be taken more seriously
- **3. LOUIS QUATORZE -** Unraced since being eliminated in a 2700m Vincennes Class C on 20 May. Is barefoot for re-entry and while not a priority should not be written off either
- **4. LE MAC -** Made up for Vincennes sanction when 3rd of 10 in a 2650m Saint-Galmier Class B in late-June. Is arguably better racing clockwise however and can be passed over
- **5. LEGOLAS -** Confirmed Caen success when comfortably winning a Class E under these conditions on 10 July. Is clearly on the way up and takes on a better field with a good hand to play
- **6. LOTHBROCK -** Imposed at Vincennes before running 2nd of 11 in a 2150m Cagnes Class D 3 weeks ago. Is never far from faulting but can finish close if he stays in stride
- **7. LE MIRACLE -** Consistent type that finished 4th of 7, despite being denied a run, in a Class D over track and trip on 17 July. Is clearly at the top of his game and will be hard to oppose if given his head
- **8. L'AMIRAL TURGOT -** Made it 2 on the trot when easily winning a 2650m Class D at Les Sables-d'Olonne 3 weeks ago. Is a colt destined for a future career in Paris and is here to prove the point
- **9. LIBRE PENSEUR MEEK -** Eliminated on re-entry in a 2900m Clairefontaine Class D on 14 July. Has done nothing noteworthy all year and is not about to start now
- **10. LAST DES BROUSSES -** 8th of 14 in a 2150m Enghien Class D a week ago. Is confirmed over longer here but has pulled an unfavourable number and is unlikely to shake things up
- **11. LEONARDO DU DERBY -** Unlucky 10th of 11 behind LOTUS DE BEYLEV (2) in a 2100m Vincennes Class D on 24 June. Will be shod this time and others easier to back

- **3. MELODY DE VIVOIN -** 2nd of 12 in a 2700m Vincennes monte Gr.1 on 22 June. Here for reasons of conditioning and can be passed over
- **4. MAGNUM DU CHOQUEL -** 6th of 8 finishers in 2150m Gr.3 Prix de Rome here early last month and will need to find considerably more
- **5. MAGIC NIGHT -** 3rd of 15 in 2700m Gr.1 Prix Albert Viel at Vincennes on 22 June. Never disappointing when applied and will not be available at 36/1 this time. Claim
- **6. MY PRINCESS** 7th of 15 behind MAGIC NIGHT (5) in 2700m Gr.1 Prix Albert Viel at Vincennes on 22 June after losing all chance at the start. Will appreciate Enghien and will not be far off the mark if she gets off on the right foot
- **7. MACK DE BLARY -** Has not been seen out since running 3rd of 14 in 2700m Gr.1 Critérium des Jeunes at Vincennes last February. Has talent to burn and although surely a race shy, can nevertheless play a leading part
- **8. MONZON NORMAND -** 3rd of 5 finishers in 1609m Gr.3 Prix Henri Cravoisier here 2 weeks ago. Has never disappointed at Enghien and should prove just as comfortable over 2875m. Place chance

Summary: Even though still never far from losing her action, MAGIC NIGHT (5) nevertheless put on an excellent show to run 3rd in the Gr.1 Prix Albert Viel last time out and should be in her element over this flat surface. Thierry Duvaldestin doesn't run his returning horses unprepared and the classy MACK DE BLARY (7) should have a realistic chance of finishing close. MONZON NORMAND (8) may not be as sharp as his stablemate but he left a good impression over a mile here recently and should have the capacity to get in on the action. MY PRINCESS (6) should not be judged on her Albert Viel run; she has bags of untapped potential.

- **2. LOVE LETTER -** Has not been seen out since running 4th of 13 to LANCIER DU GOUTIER (3) in 2700m Vincennes Gr.3 on 23 May. Shoes on for the occasion and poses no danger
- **3. LANCIER DU GOUTIER -** Has climbed the class-ladder superbly this year, latterly romping in a 2700m Vincennes Gr.2 on 7 June. Fitted with shoes this time but can still play a prominent role
- **4. FIL EK** Made up for Rome blip when 4th of 10 behind FALCO KILLER GAR (9) in 2080m Gr.1 Gran Premio Unione Europea in Modena on 26 June. Races shod for Enghien bow though and best to hold off
- **5. LOOPING DAY -** Sanctioned when going well in 19 July race of reference. Would be preferred under the saddle though
- **6. LIGHT MY FIRE -** Yet to excel as he did during the winter, most recently 6th of 7 finishers in 19 July race of reference, but it is only a question of time before he gets back in the game
- **7. LEARN TO FLY -** Put in a good performance to come 4th of 10 to FRANK GIO (11) in 2150m Gr.3 Prix de Milan here 2 weeks ago, despite being unable to express himself. In similar shape is unlikely to disappoint
- **8. LOULOU DE MYE -** Struggled for much of the year but ran close 2nd of 10 to FRANK GIO (11) in 2150m Gr.3 Prix de Milan here 2 weeks ago, and in similar form will be no shrinking violet
- **9. FALCO KILLER GAR -** Quality Italian import that was eliminated in 19 July race of reference, on first start for new yard. Has form at the highest level and it will not be long before he makes a name for himself in France
- **10. LOMBOK JIEL -** Serious colt making first appearance since winning a 2100m Vincennes Gr.2 last February. Races shod and cannot be considered a priority but is still worth keeping an eye on
- **11. FRANK GIO -** High-class colt that impressively won 2150m Gr.3 Prix de Milan here 2 weeks ago. Excels at Enghien, has nothing to prove at this level, and Matthieu Abrivard will be expecting to confirm

Summary: Gr.1 Prix Ourasi winner FRANK GIO (11) put on quite the show here a fortnight ago and, given his form and his love for Enghien, he looks set to take all the beating. Not the most fortunate that day, LEARN TO FLY (7) is plainly in fine shape and won his only start under these conditions. Sent for a short spell after winning the Gr.2 Prix Jules Thibault across town, LANCIER DU GOUTIER (3) runs shod this time but has the class to reserve himself a step on the podium. LOULOU DE MYE (8) put in a fine effort behind Matthieu Abrivard's colt last month and even though reconfigured can still challenge for a place in the frame.
