- 1. JAMBAVATI Modest individual with little flair for either code these days and can be passed over
- 2. JACOVIA MADRIK Returned to the monté code recently for the first time in 14 months, gave a good account to come 3rd, and will not be sent out at 104/1 on this occasion
- **3. JOLIE QUEEN -** Not without merit under harness but has twice failed to confirm her Beaumont success and debuts under the saddle with moderate ambition
- **4. JAMAIQUE PAJELO -** Undeniably capable but very complicated. Eric Raffin drafted in for the occasion and can get a look in if he manages to keep her trotting
- **5. JUSTESS VIKING -** Competent filly under harness but has shown a new side to herself since switching vocations and looks competitive for her first monté victory
- **6. JUNON DE VRIE -** Occasionally loses focus but has ample ability for this level. Drops marginally in category and should be good enough to make the frame this time

- **3. KEYSTONE -** No slouch when applied and most recently reassured at Cabourg. Shoes back on this time though and not an obvious choice
- **4. KELLISIA GIRL -** Made fine progress during the autumn before twice falling foul of the stewards here, but front pads fitted this time and, with application, can get a look in

- **3. HANDSOME BOY -** Has been in the form of his life since early October, winning 3 from 4. Moves up in category after scoring nicely over 2700m and, similarly shod, will have his chances
- **4. HIRO DE L'ORMERIE -** Tricky character that raced better here last month than the result would suggest. Goes barefoot again after prepping here 3 weeks ago and will have his supporters
- **5. HEVA BLONDE -** Has ample ability and has won over course and distance, but has looked rather ordinary of late and first needs to reaffirm

- 3. AMPIA MEDE SM One of the most consistent horses here and will be at peak fitness by now. Has won 4 times over track and trip, notably beating many big-hitters in Gr.1 Prix de France last February, and has every chance of winning this
- 4. DELIA DU POMMEREUX As talented as they come and ideally-placed in front, but went off the boil last season. Has yet to impress this term, but is barefoot and will generate interest
- 5. GO ON BOY Fine trotter with very good speed. Makes first start since the spell but generally takes little time to freshen up and should not be far off the mark
- 6. HAIL MARY (SWE) High-class Swedish import making his first sortie south. Expected to be race-rusty but has hind shoes off and a decent spot in front. Attention
- 7. MONI VIKING Classy element that is still going strong, one day away from his 11th birthday. Showed his form at home in Solvalla recently and, barefoot this time, is not to be entirely written off

AMPIA MEDE SM (3) acquitted herself well in the two previous 'B' races, has an excellent spot behind the car, and can secure her Prix d'Amérique berth. She will, however, be up against Elitlopp winner HOHNECK (1) who is barefoot for his first real objective of the winter, and second-line starter HORSY DREAM (12) who was forced to miss the Bourbonnais due to injury. - **11. KELLY JANE** Fine filly but can prove a handful. Has a decent record in Paris, benefits from a good entry, and can bring home the bacon
- **12. KACHA DE VANDEL** Just the one win to her name but has form at a superior level. Drops back to a more reasonable category and, if race-fit, can give this a good go
- **13. KARMINA** Dependability not her thing but gave a good account of herself here last month and, if focused, can get in on the action
- **14. KINNAIRD -** 26 races and yet to lose her maiden tag. Has no love for either Vincennes or 2700m at Vincennes, and is unlikely to generate much interest

Summary: Confirmed over course and distance and currently in excellent shape, KELLY JANE (11) put on quite the show here 3 weeks ago and, with stride in check, can double up. Unbeaten in 2 starts with hind pads on, KOKINE JABA (9) is fitted with 4 on this occasion, will be reined by Alexandre Abrivard for the first time, and is eminently capable of confirming her recent victory. KOKOTE (7) has not won since opening her account under these conditions during the spring, but is clearly in fine shape and will be no soft touch if Mathieu Mottier keeps her trotting. KACHA DE VANDEL (12) has not been seen out for over 2 months but, with hind pads fitted, could well get straight down to business.
