- 1. HISTORY MAJYC Seldom far from a fault these days and best watched for now after consecutive recent disqualifications, the latest at Rânes over 3125m on 5 May
- 2. HELENA GIRL An honest performer whose competitiveness at this level and efficiency in this configuration (barefoot) is beyond doubt. Seldom far off the mark finished 5th over 2850m at Maure-de-Bretagne on 30 April
- **3. FERVENTE** Absent since finishing 7th over 2700m at Vincennes on 30 June 2023. Best watched for now racing shod on her reappearance
- **4. HEMA DU BOIS MORIN** Consistent, lightly raced mare with sound references/form credentials, including an encouraging 4th at Cherbourg over 2625m on 1 April. Won't be far off the action
- **5. HAVANA PARIS -** She finished well to a point in the straight at Rambouillet last time over 2800m and remains capable of a lot better than her finishing position (15th) that day on 21 April. Dangerous to discount
- **6. HOSTIA -** Delicate mare with undeniable means, though is rarely far from a fault disqualified in three of her last five starts including her latest over 2800m at Cholet on 1 April. Outsider
- **7. HISA DU MARGAS -** A complicated mare but isn't devoid of ability. Rarely seen in this shoe fitting though did win at Cabourg in this configuration in August 2022 could resurface after her disqualification at Cavaillon on 9 April
- **8. HEMMA DE BRIKVIL -** Last-start winner over 2850m at Vincennes on 23 March. Has already proven her competitiveness and is racing fresh

- 2. MISS JAJA Winner over course and distance last year and 3rd in a Quinte+ over track and trip next time out but has been inconsistent/unreliable since. Best watched for now after finishing 10th over 2150m at Enghien on 12 March
- **3. DIE HARD (ITY) -** Inconsistent but is undeniably capable of fighting out the finish, especially after an improved/encouraging 3rd over 2875m at Enghien on 20 April. Keep safe
- **4. DALILA BAR -** Could only finish 11th over 2150m at Enghien on her last visit to France but had previously finished 4th twice at this venue in 2023, over 2100m in December and 2700m in February. Returns after a 5th at Milan on 25 April
- **5. DENIA -** Has gained momentum with each outing on French soil and confirmed as much with an encouraging 3rd over 2875m at Enghien on 2 May. An attractive outsider
- **6. DINGO (ITY) -** Inconsistent Italian trotter but isn't incapable of getting into the picture here, if judged on his best references. Finished 4th at Modène over 2080m on 9 April
- **7. HUGO TROJBORG -** Out of sorts at present and unlikely to trouble the judge after consecutive disqualifications the latest on his reappearance over 2875m at Enghien on 2 May

- **9. JENARO DJEMA -** Has won four of his last five completed outings (six starts), including his latest over 2100m at this venue in his first barefoot appearance on 13 April. Confirmation expected

Summary: JENARO DJEMA (9) trounced his opposition when racing barefoot for the first time in his latest outing and represents good value to repeat that feat over this longer distance. JACK DES ASS (16) is ideally entered at the ceiling of earnings and has the means to pose a threat, if avoiding disqualification - for him, this will be a question of wisdom. DIE HARD (3), PICTURE PERFECT (14), on her return to French soil, and thriving JOSEPHA CHOUP (15), who is bidding to complete a hat-trick of wins, are also competitive for a spot on the podium. Good race!

- 2. KRISSA DE MORGANE Seldom far from a fault and does appear to have gone off the boil on the evidence of her recent displays, the latest a disqualification at Enghien over 2150m on 18 April. Others preferred
- **3. KALINDA DU PARC -** Ultra-consistent filly whose competitiveness/efficiency at this level with this shoeing configuration (barefoot) is beyond doubt. Showed her form and well-being by finishing 2nd over 2700m at Vincennes on 2 April
- **4. KANELLE STAR -** Seldom far off the mark but rarely wins her races (only 1 win from 15 starts). Didn't go unnoticed when 5th on this course over 2700m on 30 April in her first outing with this shoe fitting
- **5. KARLITA MADRIK -** Delicate filly with undeniable means, though is rarely far from a fault. Finished a modest 10th over 2700m at Vincennes on 30 April but could spark improvement racing barefoot the first time in her career keep safe

- **4. HIMBERLAND -** Didn't go unnoticed last time, despite finishing 8th in the benchmark race over this course and distance on 26 April should've achieved a better result. Not taken lightly
- **5. HERCULE DE LEAU -** Confirmed the improvement of his previous outing (5th) by finishing 4th over 2725m at Graignes on 3 May. Outsider
- **6. GAGNEUR -** Runner-up in the reference race over 2850m at this venue on 26 April, taking advantage of the misfortunes of several rivals. Dark horse
- **7. FEELING BOY -** Inconsistent veteran but isn't incapable of getting a look in, if judged on his best references/form credentials, including a last-start 3rd over 2850m at Laval on 25 April

Versatile HUDO DU RUEL (12) has performed impeccably this term and has the means to fight for victory on his return to the Parisian cinder. With Benjamin Rochard engaged, HORATIUS D'ELA (10) should also play a leading role. Talented HEDE DARLING (16) isn't underestimated either, racing unshod on his belated seasonal reappearance. HARDI CROWN (2), HIMBERLAND (4) and HOVE PONT VAUTIER (14) didn't go unnoticed in the reference race and could get into the picture.

- **2. JAVA DAIRPET -** Disqualified in 8 of her 18 appearances but has revealed considerable means confirmed as much by winning under the saddle on this course last time over 2200m on 5 April. All or nothing
- **3. JUSTICIA SMART -** Seldom far from a fault in harness races at a high (Group) level but lacks references under the saddle. Caught the eye when 2nd over 2850m in a harness race on 19 April attractive outsider in the mounted code
- **4. JUS DE FRUIT -** A tricky customer but always acquits himself well when avoiding disqualification only once finished worse than 3rd in 12 completed races (18 starts). Not taken lightly, despite a recent faux pas at this venue on 26 April
- **5. JANE AIMEE -** Versatile mare who finished an encouraging 4th in a 2850m Group II on her return to the mounted code at this venue on 26 April. Should have a role to play

- **4. LUNA NOVA GWEN -** Revealed considerable promise early in her career but has lost her way recently, disqualified in both outings this year the latest in a 2175m Group III at this venue on 19 April

- **11. KARAMEL DES BOSC** Delicate (disqualified in 7 of 14 starts) but has undeniable means. Showed better application to finish 2nd at Enghien over 2875m on 18 April
- **12. KILIMANDJARO -** Consistent trotter for the most part with sound references seldom finishing far off the mark. Finished a good 4th at Argentan over 2875m on 15 April outsider
- **13. KILLER SUN DRALIAM** Consistent for the most part and usually acquits himself competitively when avoiding disqualification. Needs to reaffirm after his latest faux pas (sanction) at Cordemais over 2825m on 24 April

Summary: Consistent KROSS FINGERS (4) caught the eye with an encouraging 3rd last time and, on the evidence of that performance, could be worth siding with ahead of KOLOSSE (5) in this concluding contest. The latter is more than capable of winning this but is rarely far from a fault - for him, this remains a question of wisdom. KNOK (8), with Yoann Lebourgeois at the helm, KILLER SUN DRALIAM (13), ideally committed at the ceiling of earnings, and KOBALT (10), who shouldn't be hastily condemned despite a disappointing (9th) last start, also have the means to play a leading role.
