- **3. CHEMAR -** Sanctioned on re-entry over 2640m at San Siro on 25 April. Has been afforded time to recalibrate, is confirmed under these conditions, races barefoot, and is not about to disappoint
- **4. L.A.BOKO -** Produced a good effort to come 3rd of 9, a place behind COLBERT WF (2), in a 2625m Class B at La Rochelle on 11 May. Has placed in 2 of 3 starts over the main track and can bring the fight to COLBERT WF (2)

Gabriele Gelormini will nonetheless be minded to watch L.A.BOKO (4) who ran close to him that day, and a reconfigured HURRICANE CARTER (9) who drops back in category after a good but somewhat lacklustre performance over 2700m recently. Unplaced on that occasion, FALCOM DU BOCAGE (8) has otherwise been in cracking form and will be expected to bounce back.

- **3. JEROCASH DE PHYT'S -** Made short work of his monte debut before being sanctioned in a 2800m Rambouillet harness Class F last week. Romain Marty back in the irons and can bring home the bacon if he keeps his charge focused

- **4. MANTLER DE SIMM -** Sanctioned in a monte Gr.3 over course and distance 10 days ago and will have other ambitions

- **4. KOOPLES ERA -** Pleasant in last 2 harness starts, most recently 4th of 11 in a 2400m Beaumont-de-Lomagne Class E a fortnight back. Mathieu Mottier reining this time but still faces a stiff test on Vincennes bow
