- **2. MY QUALITA PIYA -** Back at Gr.2 level after dominating a 2875m Enghien Class C a fortnight ago. Disappointed in Prix Ozo though and can be passed over
- **3. MARION D'ATOUT -** Steps back up in category after running 8th of 10 finishers behind MARILOU (5) in a 2875m Enghien Class A 3 weeks ago and needs to raise her game
- **4. MIDNIGHT EXPRESS** Takes a hike in category after winning a 2150m Enghien Class C on 19 July but already looks out of her depth
- **5. MARILOU -** 2nd of 9 finishers in a 3000m Class B at Rochefort-sur-Loire 12 days ago. Failed to deliver on lone appearance at this level and will have few takers
- **6. MISSANDEI -** Not as sharp this term as she was earlier in the year, latterly eliminated in a 1609m Enghien Gr.3 on 19 July, but has not enjoyed the best of luck either. Unlikely to get her nose in front but on good behaviour can finish in the mix

- **3. MYSTIC SONATO -** Ran 2nd in an Enghien Gr.3 prior to losing his action in 1609m Gr.3 Prix Henri Cravoisier at the same venue just under a month ago. Has ample ability and will be no soft touch if Franck Nivard keeps him focused

- **3. KALIMERO JASMA -** Twice runner-up before failing to fire, coming 6th of 7 to LAKANA DE FELLIERE (2) in a 2250m Enghien Class C 3 weeks ago. Boasts very good references over 2175m here and is expected to bounce back and finish close
- **4. KASBAH PERRINE -** 4th to LAKANA DE FELLIERE (2) in 27 July race of reference. Faces a much stiffer test this time and will struggle to make her presence felt

- **8. MUST D'HERMES -** Was not disgraced when 5th of 9 finishers, a place behind MOJITO DE BANVILLE (2), in a 2250m Enghien Class C on 17 July. Unlikely to shake things up but can still hold his own
- **9. MACK DAIRPET -** Unraced since coming close 2nd of 14 in a 2175m Class D here mid-May. Is confirmed over the inner course and can play a prominent role on comeback
- **10. MAORI NUEVO -** Met no opposition en route to victory in a 2250m Enghien Class E 3 weeks ago and the double looks a distinct possibility
- **11. MAJOR MESLOIS -** Switches code for first time after running 2nd of 8 in a 2950m Saint-Malo harness Class D 10 days ago and if form transitions, can figure prominently

Summary: Winner at Enghien recently, at the first time of asking in this branch of the business, MAORI NUEVO (10) makes his Vincennes debut with every chance of confirming. MUST DE CHANLECY (4) has no left-handed references but he is clearly close to his race and receives an Eric Raffin ride for his ridden bow. Also new to the discipline, and good 2nd under harness recently, MAJOR MESLOIS (11) must be considered a player, as should the returning MACK DAIRPET (9) who has demonstrated decent aptitude for the code.
